#### What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding for primary school PE and sport. The PE and sport premium funding can only be spent on this provision in schools.

In 2021/22 is 16,960. The PE and Sport Premium Funding can only be sent on this provision in schools.

#### **Purpose of funding**

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport in order to:

Develop or add to the PE and sports activities that the school already offers

Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in later years

#### How will we be spending the Sports' Funding and who will benefit?

- All children will benefit by having access to at least 30 minutes of sport and physical activity per day
- The profile of PE and sport will be embedded into the school day by encouraging active break time and active lessons/teaching
- A broad range of sports will be offered to all children.
- All staff will be provided with training opportunities to increase confidence, knowledge and skills.
- Children are given the opportunity to compete in sport and physical activity, during PE sessions
